LIMITATIONS: This Contest is only open to participants during the specified times of the contest and daylight hours. Prizes will be not be awarded except during these hours.

HOW TO ENTER:

Contest is open to all Golfers

Register for contest and agree to be bound by the terms of the Official Rules.

Purchase balls. (1 ball for \$3 or 2 balls for \$5) at Paradise Valley Golf Course, to participate in Contest

You may buy as many balls and shoot everyday as much as you want. No limits to how many times you can win.

WINNING SHOT:

A winning shot must be hit from a minimum distance as follows: 10 Feet

Hole will be monitored by Tournament Officials

No practice shots

A winning shot is defined as a “ball going into hole”. If ball does not go in hole, it is not considered a winning shot.

Should you sink a ball, you automatically win a prize!

PRIZE REDEMPTION:

Prizes are not transferrable, assignable or redeemable for cash

Prizes must be accepted as awarded.
